Sermon Discussion – 17 September 2023

Read Acts 8:1-8

Getting Started Sharing from personal experience

Life is full of unexpected change. Can you recall a time in your life when you experienced a significant displacement or major loss of relationship, health, finances, etc.? How did you feel and how did you handle it?

Observation *Discovering the context*

Reread Acts 7:58-60.

- What is the significance of Stephen's death on the early church. How did it lead to the widespread persecution of Christians and the scattering of the church?
- How does the early church respond to the persecution and displacement they face?

Interpretation Discovering the meaning

- 1. Why is Philip's journey to Samaria significant in the context of the early church? How does his obedience to God's call play a crucial role in spreading the Gospel?
- 2. What is the relationship between miracles and the message of the Gospel? Why do you think miracles were performed in Acts?
- 3. Look at v. 1 and then v. 8. Discuss the idea that joy is the ultimate result of displacement. How does this align with your own experiences or observations?
- 4. Reflect on the analogy of the church as God's bellows. How does this imagery emphasise the role of the church in fanning the flame of the Gospel?
- 5. How can we cultivate trust in God during seasons of displacement? What biblical principles or promises can provide comfort and assurance?

Application Putting knowledge into practice

- How can we, as individuals and as a church, become vessels of joy to those around us?
 What are practical ways we can spread joy through the Gospel message?
- Try memorising Acts 8:4...
 "Now those who were scattered went about preaching the word."
- How has God blessed you and answered prayer this week?
